

# **Garden Ministry Update**

Our Garden Ministry is entering its 18th year of providing fresh vegetables to local food pantries, meal sites, home shelters, and senior living apartment complexes. Harvesting is underway; the cabbage harvest has been completed; almost 1500 lbs. (compared to around 1,000 lbs. last year); as of July 18th, almost 500 lbs. of cucumbers have been harvested (compared to a total harvest of only 200 lbs. last year!)

I want to thank all church members who have volunteered their time in the garden this year; special kudos to Bob Christoffersen who is taking care of several areas of the garden and to Kevin Jones who is coordinating the watering of our 487 tomato plants.

I would encourage church members to visit the plot (just north of 53rd Street on Eastern Avenue behind the parking lot of the Grace Evangelical Free Church); it looks Awesome! :-)



On Friday, August 30, at 7:30 p.m., soprano Lily Arbisser will give a vocal concert here at Asbury, accompanied by the Pleyel double grand piano. The concert is free and open to the public. Born and raised here in the Quad Cities, Lily is a 2004 graduate of Davenport Central High School. Her parents are Drs. Amir and Lisa Arbisser, retired ophthalmologists who founded Eye Surgeons Associates. Coincidentally, former Asbury member, Thea LeClair, (previous owner of the Pleyel), was a patient of Dr. Lisa's.

Lily will be performing several art songs by French composers Debussy and Faure' that received their world premier at the home of Marguerite de Saint-Marceaux, the Pleyel's piano's original owner.

Lily is the former piano student of Asbury member Marilyn Mitchem. At the age of seventeen, Lily was featured as the piano soloist in a performance of Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue* with the Quad City Wind Ensemble. Lily graduated *summa cum laude* and Phi Beta Kappa from Princeton University. She holds a Master of Music degree from Mannes College.

In August of 2019, Lily joins Ravinia's Steans Music Institute in Chicago as a vocal fellow. This season she also won first prize in the National Federation of Music Club's Young Artist Competition, was a semi-finalist in the Kurt Weill Foundation's prestigious Lotte Lenya Competition, and made her debut at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall as Suzu in Riyoichi Saito's chamber opera *Dojoji*.

Lily and her husband now live in New York City. Having heard about the devastating flooding in Davenport this spring, Lily decided to make this a benefit concert, asking for donations for flood relief to the local chapter of the American Red Cross. She's eager to return home and to share her gifts with Quad City music lovers.


