



Greetings and Happy September!

I am a huge fan of romantic comedies (rom coms). I love all the tropes. Lifelong friends fall in love. Enemies fall in love. Coworkers fall in love. Old flames fall in love. All of them fall in love. In the midst of their story, there might be a makeover or shopping montage. Or a perfect day montage. Or a getting-a-project-done montage. All of the montages. A good rom com ends with our romantic leads sharing a perfect kiss and riding off into the sunset in bliss. A good rom com reminds us of how much we love love.

I've found, in most romantic comedies, that there is always a turning point where our heroes find that they have to take a leap of faith. They can choose to stay safe and protect their heart against possible heartbreak, or they can take a leap, fall in love, and be vulnerable to all the joys and the pains of love. Our heroes are counseled by a wise friend or mentor to take the leap of faith and to open their heart to love. In short, they are asked to be reckless.

Our fall sermon series, <u>Reckless Love</u>, is not about living a rom com life. It is about acknowledging God's reckless love for us and sharing that reckless love with our neighbors. Perhaps most of us have been counseled by a wise friend or mentor to take the leap of faith and open our hearts to love of partners, friends, and family.


"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." (Matthew 5:43-44) The way of Jesus isn't just to share our love recklessly with those that we know and care for. It is to share our love recklessly with our enemies, with those who do not look like us, with those that we do not know. The reckless, all-consuming love of our romantic comedies should be a model for the way that Jesus calls us to passionately love all of our neighbors.

In one of my favorite rom coms, the hero declares to the heroine that "I would rather fight with you than make love with anyone else." The beloved community of Christianity is surely filled with many fights and disagreements. But a reckless love for one another declares that we would rather stay in relationship and love with one another than forsake the vulnerability of love for one another. We choose to take a leap of faith. We jump into love with all of the messiness, confusion, and chaos that it will bring.

Reckless love isn't easy. Reckless love involves taking chances, getting our hands dirty, and making mistakes. I have never seen a rom com where the leads made perfect choices. And I have never been in a relationship where we haven't both messed up. That is the nature of love and humanity. God's perfect grace offers us forgiveness and calls us to stay in relationship with one another through the highs and the lows. "Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love; the fellowship of kindred minds is like to that above." (UMH #557)

I hope you get a little reckless this fall. Reckless with your love. Reckless with your hospitality. Reckless with your compassion. Reckless with God's grace. Take risks, love others, and take a leap of faith.

Coming in September! Sunday Sermon Series RECKLESS LOVE by Tom Berlin

The Fall Schedule begins with the presentation of GODSPELL on Wednesday, September 4 (See article). Sunday School will begin on September 8 and the Sunday Sermon Series will begin on September 15.

The Adult Ministry Team chose RECKLESS LOVE by Tom Berlin for the Fall Sunday Sermon Series. RECKLESS LOVE will remind some of you of the karaoke guy who picks up different people each week and visits with them. Tom Berlin, a Senior Pastor of Floris United Methodist Church in Herndon, Virginia and author of several books, follows that format by picking up a different person each week and having a conversation with them as he drives around.


In the first session, Pastor Berlin picks up a man from Cuba who talks about the circle of love The second person is a music leader who talks about the fact that we must love ourselves before we are able to love others and release guilt and shame. A New Testament professor is the third person. He visits about compassion and empathy and asks what would the world be like if everyone used their gifts for others with love. The fourth person is an interracial female pastor living in Richmond, Virginia, the capital of confederate leaders. She addresses the controversial issue of what to do with the confederate statues and discusses her wrong assumptions when asked to visit a mosque. Pastor Berlin comments that Jesus is always pushing us into uncomfortable spaces. The next person is an African who was homeless through the civil war and now runs a rescue center. He covers topics of vulnerability and the fact that we can't do everything but Jesus expects us to do something. The last session is a pastor who talks about the fact that love is a skill we develop, not a feeling.

Each week, the conversations are lively, and the topics are certainly current and appropriate for where we are as a congregation/denomination. Pastor Berlin suggests that Jesus teaches us how to love God with heart, soul, mind, and strength by showing us how to love our neighbor.

PRE-REGISTER YOUR CHILDREN NOW FOR: NURSERY, SUNDAY SCHOOL, KIDS CHURCH, WEDNESDAY NIGHT KIDS & KIDS CLUB VIA THE KIDMIN APP!

Our goal is to teach kids to Rely On One True Savior. Before we can do that, we need to make sure they're safe and that our volunteers can quickly contact parents or guardians without leaving their classroom. For that reason we have implemented a new process to register and check-in your kids for classes and events using the new KIDMIN APP. This APP will help our Volunteers know exactly who is supposed to be here, if there are any allergies or anything else we should be aware for your child.

DOWNLOAD THE KIDMIN APP NOW!!!

We strongly encourage all parents/guardians to download the KIDMIN APP now to their mobile devices to get everyone pre-registered before September 8th. Here's how the KidMin App works:



- 1. Download the KidMin App onto your smart phone (<u>iPhone version</u> and an <u>Android version</u>). The KidMin icon should look like the one shown here when it's on your phone.
- 2. Create an account and add your children this process is super fast!
- 3. Use the EXPRESS Check-in up to four hours before each class or service to check your kids in!
- 4. Pick up your and your children's stickers at the check-in station.
- 5. Drop the kids off at their assigned room.
- 6. Pick the kids up from their assigned room.

Starting September 8th, those that have pre-registered can take advantage of the EXPRESS CHECK-IN. Express check-in can be done up to 4 hours before your kids arrive for their class/service saving you time at check-in! The express check-in station will be located on the lower level off the West stairwell. Just look for the bright green wall with the Roots Kids Logo and pick up the express check-in tags that will be waiting for you.

NURSERY PARENTS! Please note, the nursery has a check-in kiosk just inside the nursery door. Simply type in your phone number, select your child's name and check-in. Your tickets will immediately print out at the Nursery Kiosk! For those who are checking in older kids as well as nursery aged children, we encourage you to utilize the express check-in, just know that the EXPRESS CHECK-IN stickers are only printed at the Express Check-in station located downstairs. The KIOSK in the nursery works very fast, and is perfect to use as well, especially if you only have a nursery age child to check-in.

2yrs - 5th Grade


Check-In - A Parent/Guardian must accompany your child(ren) to the check-in station in order to get your matching stickers and then proceed to drop them off at the Tree House (lower fellowship hall).

Check-Out - A parent/guardian must come to your child's individual classroom for pick-up showing your sticker to the teacher/volunteer. *Please respect our volunteers/staff time who so lovingly give their service to be here at Asbury for your children each week by coming promptly to pick up so your child(ren) so our volunteers are free to go to their Sunday activities as soon as possible.*

Junior High and High School

Check-in – Teens must also be checked in through the KidMin app for attendance purposes. They may pick up their stickers and go straight to their classrooms where they can give the stickers to their teachers.

Check-out - Teens and are free to meet up with their families upon release from their teachers. *Please ensure your Junior High and High School kids have been told a designated location to reconnect with your family.*

Did you know that 8 states have already banned the use of plastic grocery bags? 
