Rejoice, Count Your Blessings and Be Thankful!

There are many reasons for us to be thankful. We can always be thankful to certain people who love or befriend us. But what about all the other blessings—the wonders of sky, sea, and land? What about life itself? The ability to say, "Thank You, Lord," is among the most wonderful things about being a follower of Jesus.

We can enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise. We can thank and praise Him because He is the God from whom all blessings flow.

With thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4)

Jesus-followers are the only people who can truly thank God for all His blessings, even when times are tough. The Lutheran minister Martin Rinkart wrote a hymn of thanksgiving to rally his village of Ellenburg, Saxony, during the ravages of the Thirty Years' War. Rinkart was the only surviving pastor and he sometimes conducted as many as fifty funerals a day. Yet, he kept himself and his village sane by finding items of thanksgiving. He wrote the hymn:

Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices; Who wondrous things has done, in whom this world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today.

How can we cultivate a spirit of thanksgiving like that? Remember the words of Paul: "Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand."

(Philippians 4:6-7 NLT)



In his book, WORRY LESS, LIVE MORE, Robert Morgan offers habits which help to develop an attitude of gratitude:

- **Keep a thanksgiving list.** Begin your morning prayer time by listing something for which you are grateful.
- Before you fall asleep at night, thank God for three things that happened during the day. I begin the day with one item of thanksgiving and end it with three. It puts my mind in a better place before I fall asleep.
- **Keep a thanksgiving journal.** Just log two or three things each day for which you're thankful.

Give thanks at meals.

- Whenever you encounter a disappointment or disaster, try to specifically locate and list items for which you can be thankful, even in the midst of the problem. Write them in your journal, on your calendar, or in a text to yourself—whatever works to focus your mind on them. The Bible says, Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. (1 Thessalonians 5:18)
- **Express your gratitude to others.** Let people at work (home, church, school) know that you're grateful for their work. When we express our appreciation to coworkers it increases the overall effectiveness of the organization.

Read books on gratitude.

Sing thanksgiving songs and hymns like "Now Thank We All Our God." Sing, sing, sing out loud. It will begin to lift your spirits.

Memorize some thanksgiving passages. Psalm 100 is a good place to begin.

Remember Philippians 4:6 and write out the verse where you can see it. Underline, capitalize or color the words WITH THANKSGIVING.

I'm sure that all of us can list many things regarding Asbury for which we can be thankful. As we move forward (with Reckless Love) and experience God's work among us, may we remember to rejoice and be thankful!

Last year our Finance Team anticipated a shortfall in giving vs. the projected expenses of approximately \$50,000. A *Strike-a-Match* campaign was initiated in which several families donated seed money above-and-beyond their annual contributions. The entire congregation was then invited to follow their lead with matching giving. 57 families participated in this effort and donated \$40,245 which covered the shortfall for 2018.

Based on giving/pledge numbers so far in 2019 a similar shortfall was expected by the end of the year, so it was decided to do one more *Strike-a-Match* campaign. 29 families contributed over \$20,000 through birdies-for Charity! It is not too late to contribute to *Strike-a-Match*. We hope you will consider make a one-time donation above your current pledge to help us provide vital ministries that are building bridges for Jesus in our community. November Congregational Challenge Less Food Waste

Every year, Americans throw away about \$165 billion of food.

594 million pounds of food enter Iowa landfills each year!

More than 1/3 of all food that we raise or grow never makes it onto our plates.

This means that some of the land, water, chemicals, and greenhouse gas emissions associated with food production aren't necessary.

Explore "on line": 34 Ways to Waste Less Food and The Food Rescue Partnership

Challenge: 1. Only buy what you need.

- 2. Use all fresh fruits, vegetables, meat and dairy purchased.
- 3. Be sure to eat leftovers from homemade meals and restaurants.
- 4. Donate extra food (contact Churches United or Riverbend Food Bank)

Terracycle

Items will be collected in a bin located in our main floor west coat closet and in the under-the-stairs recycling area. These items will be donated to the Terracycle program located at Trinity Lutheran Church in Moline. Terracycle recycles items that are not accepted in our city recycling program. We will begin by collecting:

Plastic cereal bag liners from inside cereal boxes

Chip snack bags - family or individual size, any brand (No candy bags please)

Green Church

New recycling bins have been added to both of our church kitchens. When preparing food at Asbury, please place clean tin cans, bottles, glass jars and any item that is normally collected by the Bettendorf/Davenport citywide recycling program into these bins.

We have set a goal to purchase paper plates, instead of Styrofoam, when there is a need for disposable plates for church gatherings.

A few weeks ago, my family spent time in Dubugue at the National Mississippi River Museum and Aquarium. We got a chance to see aquatic animals and to learn more about the mighty Mississippi River. One of the highlights of our afternoon was the chance to pet stingrays. We rolled up our sleeves to dip our hands deep into the stingray tank and wait for the animals to float near us so we could skim our fingers along their skin.

My three-year-old son, Ben, was eager to dunk his whole arm into the stingray's habitat, quickly soaking his long-sleeve t-shirt. For several minutes, the animals glided past him at the very bottom of the tank, much too deep for Ben's preschool arm to reach. Finally, as we were getting ready to move on to the next exhibit, the rays finally swam at a higher altitude where Ben could reach them. Unfortunately, as soon as the stingrays were within reach, Ben shrank away in fear, letting out the whimper of a child still learning how to "use his words."

We tried holding on to Ben's hand to get him to touch the stingrays that were now dancing closer, but it was no good. Ben was frightened. And as soon as the stingrays moved past him to continue their loops around the tank. Ben would dip his hands into the water, eager to touch them again.

It was the behavior of a child that doesn't make much logical sense. He wanted so badly to be able to pet these strange and beautiful animals. But when the opportunity presented itself, he shrank back out of the fear of the uncertainty. We couldn't force his hand or logic him into holding still. Instead, it was an opportunity that will have to wait for another visit and his own maturity.

As I was considering this incident with Ben and the stingrays, it seemed to have powerful parallels to each of us and our journey of discipleship and mature Christianity. How often have you thought to yourself that you would like to have a better prayer life, that you want to be more generous with yourself and what you've been given, that you want to take another step of faith? And how often, when the opportunity presents itself, have you shrank back in fear? I think we are all caught up in an eternal paradox of wanting to be more like Christ, but not ever wanting to make changes to how we are already living.

Our next sermon series, "Following Jesus with Mister Rogers," begins October 27th and goes through November 24th. The series is about lessons that Mister Rogers can teach us, but also about deeper discipleship. I hope that you pick up a devotional booklet in the next few weeks at either entrance to the church. The sermons can be seen as "stingrays" that show us the beauty of devotion to God and deep Christian discipleship. The booklets can help you evaluate where you are leaning in and where you are drawing back out of fear. My prayer is that you take that step of faith, be willing to make changes and try new things, and that your relationship with God will grow ever deeper.





Let Advent Transform Your "Bah Humbug" into "God Bless Us Everyone"!

Advent Study, The Redemption of Scrooge **By Matt Rawle**

Do you remember reading or watching Charles Dickens' A CHRISTMAS CAROL? Probably, the first thing that comes to mind is Scrooge's famous words, "Bah, Humbug!" And then, there are the three ghosts - the Ghost of Christmas Past, Present and Yet to Come. And, of course, Tiny Tim.

Matt Rawle, the leading pastor of Asbury United Methodist church in Bossier City, Louisiana, loves to tell a familiar "pop" story in a new way. He contends that many of our well-known stories are based on Biblical principles. A CHRISTMAS CAROL is one of those stories that preaches the Gospel clearly. Rawley's goal and hope is that we'll begin to see spiritual truths in books, movies, TV, and the world around us.

In this study, the familiar Advent themes of Peace, Hope, Love and Joy are all present along with a lot of scripture references, questions for thought, hymns, and a reflection and prayer to end each week's reading.
