Greetings....from Pastor Tom

Jesus is the Bridge.

These are four simple words, but they are meant to be a clear, concise and compelling way to express the heart of who we are, what we believe and what we hope to accomplish as Asbury United Methodist Church.

Last year we engaged the services of a professional coach to help us become healthier and more effective in our mission. The Rev. Dr. Phil Maynard has helped us to identity two areas of emphasis that can have the greatest positive impact. The first was developing a clear process for making disciples of Jesus Christ. The second was ministry with children in our community. The ministry strategy team formed two subgroups to address each area. Here's an update on what they are doing.

Regarding our ministry with children in the community, we have begun by establishing positive, trusting relationships. We continue to make connections with leaders from Mark Twain and Neil Armstrong Elementary schools. You'll see in this edition of the Good News information about helping with a reading day at Mark Twain Elementary. We also have been helping to make blessing bags with hygiene products available to school personnel to offer to families where they see a need. The important thing is that each person in our church is open to how God might want you to care for the children in our community through you. The team will continue to coordinate opportunities, but all of us can also be responsible to finding our individual ways to serve.

The other area is a clear process for making disciples of Jesus Christ. The mission of the United Methodist Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. That is our mission as Asbury as well. Unfortunately, over the years many churches have taken discipleship for granted and neglected to have in place a clear way for it to happen. Our strategy team is developing a process using "Jesus is the Bridge" as a guiding image.

The graphic on the opposite page uses that bridge theme and shows the five vows that United Methodists make when they join a local congregation. We commit to support the church by our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. The team is developing guidelines to help all of us assess where we are in each of those five vows. The goal is to move from a beginning interest in a relationship with Jesus to becoming maturing disciples who are also helping others to grow as disciples of Jesus as well.

For our sermon series in February, we'll begin with the importance of prayer. We'll be using Jesus' teaching on the Lord's Prayer to explore the heart of prayer. There will be valuable insights on how we can move from occasional prayer to a powerful prayer life that is an expression of a deep relationship with Jesus.

We are on this journey together. There is a wonderful future that God has for us and Jesus is the bridge that will get us there.
