

The weather is cold and winter is here! Preparations have been made to open our warming station at Asbury.



We all take care of the wheels on our cars and have the treads checked periodically. Well, we should do the same for our personal "wheels"—our feet!

A specialist (Amanda) from Unity Point at Home will be at Asbury to meet with you for a 30 minute appointment. She will soak your feet in warm water; wash and dry them. Your toenails will be gently cleaned and trimmed. Amanda will remove any debris from the skin, between the toes and around and under the toenails.

Greetings and Happy March!

On Wednesday, February 26th, we begin the 40-day journey of Lent with the observance of Ash Wednesday. I always find this worship service meaningful, as I come face-to-face with the reality of my own mortality. We are all but dust, yet God calls and claims each of us to be part of God's mission in the world so long as we have breath in our lungs.

For me, Ash Wednesday is not just a reminder of the fleeting nature of our lives, but also the fleeting nature of our convictions. The beautiful song "Sunday's Palms are Wednesday's Ashes" (The Faith We Sing #2138) is a reminder that the ashes we use to begin our Lenten journey come from the burned palms of Palm Sunday the year prior. That which was used to celebrate and exalt our Savior was burned in the fire to symbolize our own short-lived progress in Christian discipleship. After every step forward and every commitment to deeper relationship with God, we can end up taking two steps back into the selfishness and death of our own nature.

Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday are traditionally the two bookends of Lent, respectively marking the beginning of the 40 days and the beginning of Holy Week. This year, as we use Dr. Amy-Jill Levine's book <u>Entering the Passion of Jesus</u> as our guide for the season, we will be experiencing Lent in a different way. The first Sunday of Lent will be our celebration of the palms, of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We will then spend the next five weeks of the season looking in-depth at the events of Holy Week: Jesus cleansing the Temple, Jesus teaching, Jesus anointed by a woman, Jesus sharing in the Passover meal, and Jesus praying in the garden. Each week will be marked by a risk that Jesus was taking on his final week of ministry.

And so, those who plan worship and those on the Adult Ministry Team are taking a risk as well, trying Lent a little differently this year, hoping that spending the entire season focused on Jesus' final week will allow you to see the story in a new way. Placing Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday only four days apart will be a true reminder of the short-lived nature of our commitments to God. Will Sunday's palms burn away into Wednesday's ashes? Will you be able to keep traditional Lenten pledges of prayer, fasting, penance, giving, and service? Can you begin new habits of Christian discipleship that can continue far beyond Easter?

Let's try it out together. Let's commit to a Holy Lent together, as one body, trusting in God as we take risks, and trusting in the new life that comes after this liturgical season of loss and death.

I invite you to join us for worship on Ash Wednesday on February 26th at 7pm and the first Sunday of Lent on March 1st. Pick up a copy of <u>Entering the Passion of Jesus</u> at either entrance and join a small group. May you grow ever closer to God during this time of recognizing your own vulnerability and gratitude for God's guidance.
