Hello Asbury family! For those of you that have not met me my name is Rob Gagnon. My wife Lesley and I have been married sixteen years and have three sons; William age 9, Alex age 11, and Curtis age 13. We have been members of Asbury for the past six vears.

In the September 9th Newsletter Pastor Tom talked about perspective and mountaintop moments. It got me thinking about my personal mountaintop moments and what led me to volunteer to work with our High School youth.

A few years ago I was having coffee with Jerry Roskens. We were discussing spiritual gifts and sharing how we each felt we could best serve our Asbury family. I told him that I thought I should work with the high school youth, but I was hesitant. My excuse list for not serving was very lengthy. After I completed sharing, Jerry smiled and said "In Gods time. Just pray on it."

It reminded me of another moment when I was approached to help with high school youth and was told that I clearly had a gift for working with young people. When I reminded him my children were all under ten, leaving me with little experience, he responded by reminding me...true, they are, but you have mentored young people for almost three decades on four continents while in uniform. "Pray about it", he said, "you will know when the time is right".

The final mountaintop moment that comes to mind occurred just in recent months. It is the most significant one for me. Some of the high school youth asked me to lead the group. Their names shall remain anonymous but not the credit they deserve for me saying yes.

Am I out of my comfort zone taking on this ministry? Yes, I am. Will I make mistakes? Yes, I will. However, with the love and support of our Asbury Family, and most importantly your prayers, I am confident this undertaking will succeed.
