Senior Pastor's Annual Report for 2020



One new I-74 bridge is finally open! Especially in a year like 2020, we shouldn't overlook the good accomplishments that are still happening. We have been using the new I-74 Bridge as a parable for our church. Just like the need for a new bridge, we've known that our church needs to evolve and adapt to the constantly changing world around us. That has never been more true than during this past year. The good news is that we too are making good progress.

We started the year with the goals of developing an intentional discipleship pathway and strengthening our ministry with children in the community. We also were going to research reinstating a preschool and begin the development of a neighborhood captains program.

Then everything changed when the coronavirus impacted our world. We quickly adapted to worship online and virtual meetings over the internet on Zoom. The new sound system and video equipment that the church had recently installed turned out to be a lifesaver. We have made many technological advances that we could not have imagined just a year ago.

And through it all, as we are adapting we are becoming more resilient. We've strengthened our prayer ministry with people ready to pray for and with persons in need. Our desire to offer ministry with children in the community resulted in stronger relationships with our local schools as we helped with food and other needs during the pandemic. We did investigate reinstating a preschool but determined that it was not feasible with our building limitations. We are in the process of developing "neighborhood bridge builders" to help us connect with our members and community in the neighborhoods where they live.

Add to that the birth of a new baby to Pastor Heather and Chris Dorr and there have been several good things happen this year for which we can be thankful.

If 2020 has taught us anything, it is that things can change in a moment. Our theme for the coming year of 2021 is to be *Ready for Anything*.

And while it is good to report that progress is being made, we're not done yet. Our goals for the coming year are listed on another page and include a study of our physical building and organizational structures. We need to continue to adapt in order to become more effective in the post-pandemic world that is coming. Just like there is another bridge to be completed across the river, there is also more that we need to accomplish.



Message from Pastor Heather Dorr

2020 was not a year that any of us had anticipated. There was no preparation in place for an unprecedented global pandemic. I had set goals to work on introducing a discipleship pathway for Asbury and to take a fresh look at how we could do mission work as a church. Both of these plans went sideways, but I believe God took us in new directions.

Asbury's Strategy Team has discerned a need for all of us to intentionally grow in our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. This year, we have seen the death of the prayer list and the birth of a new Prayer Team, which connects individuals with those willing to pray for and with them. We are offering more prayers and more timely prayers than ever before. This year, we have seen the loss of physical presence in our church building and the birth of new ways to connect and be together. We've been able to have people join us in worship and in Zoom small groups from near and far away. This year, we have seen the end of passing the plate in worship in the building and the amazing response of this church to follow through with planned estimates of giving. This year, we have seen plans for mission and partnerships fall apart even as new ones have sprung up in the midst of pandemic needs. This year, we have seen an inability to welcome someone to worship in the church building even as we have seen the ease of inviting someone to tune into Facebook Live on a Sunday morning from their own home.

As many things have been lost, so much has been gained.

I am looking forward to the exciting ways of continuing the work of a discipleship pathway here at Asbury, using the things we have learned in 2020. I am also excited about new leaders who are passionate about mission. These leaders would do the discerning and administrative work of planning so that the rest of the church can be sent out in mission to change the community and the world. A

long-term goal would be that each person at Asbury is engaged in mission work on behalf of the church to be building the Kingdom of God here on earth.

We do not know what 2021 will bring, but we pray it is an end to the pandemic and a return to our ability to be face-to-face. 2020 will forever change this church just as it will forever change each of us. My prayer is that we have been changed for the better, becoming more grateful, more resilient, and more responsive to God's call in our lives.

I thank each of you for your prayers and your support as my family welcomed baby Emmett. And I thank you for your flexibility and your passion as we traveled through the surprises and the joys of this past year.

During September, 2019 thru March 15, 2020 when we closed the church due to the pandemic, there were 211 adults in a group including 52 during the Sunday School hour. During this time, there were around an average of 251 people in worship. That number includes children, so it is not possible to get a totally accurate account of the percentage of adults who participated in a group, but it is around 84% (Up from 74% last year).

There were over 20 different service projects and donations in Asbury, Bettendorf, the Quad Cities and beyond that were completed during this time.

Three Sunday Sermon and Study Series were offered: RECKLESS LOVE by Tom Berlin, THE REDEMPTION OF SCROOGE by Matt Rawle, and ENTERING THE PASSION OF JESUS by Amy-Jill Levine.

Since March, 2020, when Covid-19 became a factor, the Discipleship Groups have all gone to Zoom meetings. Currently, ADVENTURES IN FAITH and AGAPE are meeting together on Sunday mornings. EXPLORATIONS had also joined that group, but Realff Ottesen's health has now allowed him to return to teaching. They are currently studying John Wesley and what it means to be a Methodist. Additional groups continuing to meet via Zoom include WINGS: Wednesday Inspirational Night (of) Group Study, Thursday Evening Bible Study and various ARM groups.

Summer Adult Sunday School, "Hymns We Love" was led by Don Mitchem with an average of 21 people meeting via Zoom each Sunday morning.

Currently, there are some groups that are involved in service projects. Hiney Heroes, donations to the Thrift Center, Garden Ministry, and building projects by the Men's group continue. There have been volunteers doing the painting and expansion of the TreeHouse inside the church. Plans are being made to ring bells for the Salvation Army at K & K Hardware. Money has been and continues to be donated to various organizations.

Obviously, it is harder "to track" people at this time. The Adult Ministry Team continues to offer materials to the groups that are meeting and we are hopeful that the goal of disciplining, educating, developing leaders, and reaching others continues even thru this difficult time of not being in close physical contact with others.

Children & Youth Ministries Report to the Congregation

Greetings Families of Asbury Church! As the Director of Children and Youth Ministries, I am excited to highlight the programs and our accomplishments that have taken place within the Children and Youth Ministries at Asbury United Methodist Church over the past year.

Our Sunday School program had a wonderful year of teaching about God's love in age appropriate small groups. When the Covid 19 Pandemic hit our nation, we had to pause our in person programing. After realizing this was going to be a longer term than we realized, we began making videos for kids to watch online starting with Easter and have continued to provide various online videos, a few in person drop offs which included the remaining Sunday School curriculum, May Day baskets and Bibles for 3yrs, 3rd Grade and Confirmation ages, Advent Activity Bags, Christmas Ornament Crafts and most recently RootsKids Moments shown during the church online broadcast.

Kids Church was held during the 11am worship hour in the TreeHouse where lessons were taught through use of Bible story telling characters, puppets, kids worship leaders and actors. This was met with very positive feedback both from the kids and their parents who enjoyed attending church while their children worshiped at their level and in their own fun space.

Our youth group had an engaging year up until the Pandemic as well. We met each Wednesday night and enjoyed various activities from the trampoline park to singing at the nursing homes during Christmas and a 24 hour Lock In with 40 kids!

While we've been closed down, the TreeHouse has been updated with additional touches to help finish off the look thanks to Kevin Jones and Dan Howell's incredibly hard work. We look forward to when we can have the children back to enjoy the space created with them in mind!

We found a creative way to still have VBS with an outdoor Drive In style event held in our overflow parking lot. "God Is In ConTROLL" was a hit with kids and their parents. Three nights of Bible stories, Trolls leading worship (by our Jr High kids) and creative surprises brought us all together in a fun but safe way.

The Christmas season brought Starry Night to Asbury where many adults, teens and children participated in telling the story of baby Jesus with vinettes throughout the church building. We hope to bring this event back when it is once again safe to open our doors to the public.

It is my honor to serve the Lord here at Asbury and I look forward to the future in 2021!

The Parish Nurse Program has concentrated on development of a wholeness-in-health ministry and bringing together one's spiritual and physical needs, which will enable one to experience the life God promised through Christ....to live life abundantly!



Parish Nurse Goals for 2021

- 1. With the addition of another Parish Nurse, we are able to offer more programming and classes to our congregation. Example: Foot Clinic and Blood Drive
- 2. With the help of the Pastors, we revised the Prayer Chain and developed a leadership Prayer Team that oversees the Joy and Concerns and is updated weekly with the Parish Nurses and the Pastors.
- 3. A Strategic Planning Committee has been developed and we will continue to assess the needs of our church while under the affects of the Covid-19 pandemic.
- 4. Continue with Grief Share classes using online support.

Asbury Parish Nurse Program and Breakdown of Services

- 1. Contacts made by the nurses since January 2020 average 80-90 people each month.
- Sympathy cards are mailed to our members. One-year anniversary of death cards are mailed.
- 3. We were asked to give the prayer for the Unity Point Hospital for Donor Celebration Day, however it was cancelled due to the Covid virus pandemic.
- 4. Guidelines for visits:
 - a. Hospital, hospice, notice of death visits (as needed)
 - b. Skilled Care- weekly visits
 - c. Memory Care Checks monthly visits
 - d. Long-term Care monthly visits
 - e. Assisted Living monthly visits
 - f. Independent Living quarterly visits
- 5. Monitor visiting notes by others on the Asbury website. Intervene when red flags or concerns are detected and do a follow-up visit.
- 6. Exercise class meets twice a week in the upper fellowship hall. (On hold due to Covid.)
- 7. Hospital visits Pastors and parish nurses take turns during the week to visit those in the hospital. (Will resume when restrictions have changed.)
- 8. Submit health information on the announcement loop and the Asbury website and Facebook.
- 9. Follow up with all prayer request cards that are submitted as well as requests made through the online *Caring Congregation* prayer request form.
- 10. Offer Grief Share Classes twice a year. This is an 11-week program. Also offer Grief Share "Surviving the Holidays" once a year or online as needed.
- 11. Offer blood pressure checks to members upon request.
- 12. Help set up health programs and/or speakers for different classes throughout the year
- 13. Newborn Ministry Make a home visit and provide a gift basket with special gifts for the family.
- 14. Meet weekly with the pastors to update health related concerns of parishioner visits and keep each other informed.
- 15. Manage Angel Fund offering help to members when needed. Example: gas gift cards
- 16. Offer an all-church Afghan Ministry to the Bettendorf and Davenport community.
- 17. Coordinate and serve luncheons at funerals with the help of the Funeral Committee. We are available at the funerals for family support. (On hold during pandemic)
- 18. Attend Church Council meetings monthly on Zoom
- 19. Maintain and monitor first-aid kits throughout the church. Put together and maintain travel first-aid kits.
- 20. A nurse is present during the hours of Grace Events or VBS.
- 21. Outreach Program to those in need (not necessarily church members). Provide food baskets at Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter and food for the Bettendorf after-school program.
- 22. Make sure all staff have CPR provided to keep their status updated.
- 23. Monitor, maintain and educate staff on AED in the church. Offer education to congregation on use of AED annually.
- 24. Provide monthly reports to Unity Point Parish Nurse Program Manager.
- 25. Maintain a library of health resources located in the parish nurse office.
- 26. Parish nurses attend classes on health issues around the area as provided and attend the monthly parish nurse meetings held by Unity Point.
- 27. Maintain confidentiality for all our members.
- 28. We are available 24/7 and receive calls at all hours and days of the week.

During 2020 the trustees have tried to take advantage of the time while the building was not in use. There have been several projects to update the building interior.


A major accomplishment was the installation of a remote locks on the Main and Office entrances. An indoor motion detection security system is also installed.





Worship at Asbury was met with new opportunities this year as we transitioned to an on-line presence, in March, due to the pandemic. Our Worship Team stepped up to meet the challenges of online worship. Creativity thrived, our musicians came together virtually, we experienced drive-up communion, and outdoor baptisms. Advent took us into the homes of our Asbury friends, and Christmas Eve gave us three different worship experiences. We were able to adapt special Sundays to a virtual format such as Confirmation, All-Saints Sunday, and Blanket Sunday.

As we look forward to 2021, we will continue to implement creative worship events, expand our knowledge and use of technology, and we will be prepared to safely return to in-person worship when the time is right.

Our Garden Ministry continues to be blessed with a harvest of about 34,500 lbs. of fresh vegetables that were distributed to 19 organizations that include food pantries, meal sites, home shelters, and senior living apartment complexes. In addition, some produce was distributed to individual families. Since its beginning in the spring of 2002, over 600,000 lbs. of fresh vegetables have been distributed. We believe that caring for God's Creation is an essential part of our Christian faith. We honor Gods' Creation by protecting and preserving it for future generations. We acknowledge truth of what is happening in our world, look for ways to put our faith into action by caring for Creation and seek to provide hope for those who may be in despair over climate events. Every person is invited to be a steward of Creation.

The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church states:

"All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings. God has granted us stewardship of creation."

"Stewardship is the wise and careful management of someone else's resources. Stewards are entrusted with something valuable, sometimes priceless, that belongs to another."

We may be uncomfortable thinking and talking about our world's pollution, the climate crisis, species going extinct etc. It's depressing. Meanwhile, the planet, humans and other living creatures are in distress. How should we respond as Christians? As Christians we have a call to help those in distress, a responsibility to educate ourselves and make necessary changes in our lives. Here at Asbury, we can choose to learn, plan and respond to these topics. We will be posting special events and monthly challenges in upcoming "Good News" and on our Facebook site @AsburyStewardsOfCreation . (There is not a regular time or place to meet.)

Stewards of Creation Seeks to:

- 1. Initiate ways Asbury can become a "Green Church".
- 2. Provide awareness of recycling opportunities, environmental changes and climate concerns through books, movies, speakers, Facebook posts and field trips.
- 3. Give notification of church or community events related to recycling, protecting the environment and climate change awareness and action.
- 4. Provide opportunities to talk with other Christians about these topics. Together we can learn the truth about this subject and seek hope.
- 5. Encourage everyone through "monthly challenges" to take meaningful Creation care actions in our individual lives and together as a church community.

Since our Stewards of Creation ministry was created in August of 2019

- Some activities included: Tours of the Scott Area Recycling Center, "Everything Connects" documentary film and guest speakers Kurt Liske Scott Area Recycling and Karen Nader with Terracycle.
- We started an ongoing Terracycle Collection located at Asbury (Plastic cereal bag liners and Chip/Snack bags)
- Green Church initiatives Added recycling bins, goal to omit Styrofoam products for kitchen use and energy efficient LED lightbulbs added including new outdoor lighting fixtures.
- Response cards Opportunity to tell our story as we respond to the challenge to care for Creation.
- New Communication through Facebook Stewards of Creation page. This page primarily gives suggestions for responding to our monthly challenges and offers an awareness of the many ways to support Creation.
- In 2019-2020 nineteen different "monthly challenges" were offered for consideration.
