
# We are Returning to Worship in the Building in Phases:

### **Staffing Update**

It has previously been announced that Pastor Heather has been appointed to serve the First United Methodist Church of Jefferson, Iowa beginning on July 1.

In preparation for that change, our district superintendent has given Asbury three options:

- 1. Receive another full-time associate pastor.
- 2. Eliminate the associate pastor position.
- 3. Leave the associate pastor position in place but not fill it at this time. This option would allow the church to experiment with filling our leadership needs with a combination of specialized part-time staff.

The church council and Staff Parish Relations Committee have decided to pursue option number three. This option has the potential to provide some cost benefits as well as enabling us to seek staff with specialized skills.

The Staff Parish Relations Committee is currently discerning our staffing needs and developing a plan to put in place this summer. Please be in prayer for this group as they define the job descriptions and begin the process of seeking qualified candidates.
