New Organizational Plan Begins Now!

We are ready to begin a new way to operate as a church with a plan to increase engagement, to be more action-oriented and to make efficient use of people's time. All ministries and committees have been grouped into five main ministry areas: Worship, Discipleship, Welcome & Care, Missions and Administrative Support.

A key new element is the identification of co-leaders for each of these five areas. This group of leaders will operate as a Strategy Team to ask strategic questions such as: "What we should be doing next?" and "How should we be changing to become more effective?".
