First of all, thank you to those who donated blood at our most recent blood drive! We collected 18 units of blood. Your next opportunity to donate at Asbury will be November 14th.

We are reminded almost daily, that COVID is still affecting our lives.

The CDC has posted their recommendations to follow if you have been exposed or have tested positive:

- 1. If you suspect that you may have COVID or may have been exposed, you should isolate if you test positive. If you test negative, no isolation is required.
- 2. After a positive test, if you have symptoms you should stay home and isolate as much as possible from family for five days.
- 3. After 5 days, you may end your isolation if you are fever free for 24 hours and your symptoms are improving. You should wear a mask when in public for another 5 days.
- 4. If there is no improvement and/or you still have a fever, continue to isolate. If your symptoms become worse, you should see your doctor. There are possible antibody treatments available.
- 5. If you have a positive test for COVID, it is always your option to contact your doctor immediately especially if you have other existing health issues.
