

The following information is from an article published by the Illinois Extension/University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign

* * * * * Church Council Follow-Up * * * * * *

The Church Council met in September with a primary topic of sharing information about the current separation happening in the United Methodist denomination. The central issue for the division is differences in perspective on how to interpret scripture and represent Jesus to persons in the LGBTQIA community.

A new denomination called the Global Methodist Church (https://globalmethodist.org/) has formed and some United Methodist congregations are choosing to disaffiliate from the United Methodist denomination. The reason they are leaving at this time is that a special session of the General Conference held in 2019 provided a way for local congregations to leave the denomination and take their property and buildings with them. However, that provision only lasts until December 31 of 2023. That means that any congregation seeking to leave the United Methodist denomination with their property must go through the process to decide before that deadline.

The next quarterly meeting of the Church Council will be on Monday, December 19. It will be an all Church Conference that will celebrate our ministries and set goals for the coming year. It will include an opportunity to decide if there is enough interest to formally explore disaffiliation. The hope is that discussions will continue in our congregation to seek God's light on a way forward to our congregation. Pastor Tom and the Leadership Team will be providing more resources in the coming weeks to help us be informed.
