Pastor's Annual Report

2021

Our theme for 2021 has been *Ready for Anything*. As we come to the end of the year, it feels good to say that we made it!

We are adapting to monumental societal changes caused by the pandemic. We're also learning how to manage a significant staffing realignment and the ongoing reality of long-time members moving out of the area to be closer to family. The truth is that we're not coming back to the way things were. We are coming back to a new world that is different from the one we left. As your pastor, it is not my job to tell people what to do. It is a leader's job to get "up on the balcony" to seek a broader perspective and tell people what I see.

One of this year's goals was to study our physical and organizational structures in order to make them more effective. One team, led by Kevin Jones, is developing recommendations to make our facilities more safe, functional and inviting. Another team, led by Steve Sorensen, is helping us through a significant realignment of our paid staff, as well as a new way to organize our committee structure.

One example of our staffing realignment this year was shifting from one full-time associate pastor to multiple part-time staff members who can meet specific needs. This allowed us to address another goal of improving our online presence by welcoming Carrie Meumann into the new position of Producer of Creative Worship and Media. A second proposal that is in process will address the need for additional staff time to help people become more engaged in the life of the church. This person would help motivate and manage our Neighborhood Bridge Builders program. We've made a good start with the Neighborhood Bridge Builders this year and we want to build on that foundation.



Our ongoing challenge in this changing world is learning how to develop trusting relationships with people outside the church. Some of the ways we are making connections with people are through our online presence, the Neighborhood Bridge Builders and special community events such as Fall-O-Ween and One Starry Night. Our hope is that these relationships can help people develop deeper and more meaningful relationships with God and other people. We have been calling this a discipleship pathway and it is an expression of our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We have more work to do but we are definitely on our way.

This year we also saw the completion of the I-74 Bridge project in our community. We've been using the new bridge as an analogy for our life as a church. They say that the bridge should last for a hundred years into the future. That future will be a result of the work that we've been observing for the past several years. The same can be said for the Church of Jesus Christ. The investments that we make in the people of our community, especially the children and young people, will have an impact far into the future. That is why we need to keep up our work, for the sake of the people like my grandchildren who will come after us. Because whether it is investing in growing disciples of Jesus or being good stewards of our planet, our actions now will have an impact long after we're gone. That is why our theme for 2022 will be *The Future is Now.* It will continue to be challenging work, but it will be well worth the effort for the sake of the people that God loves. With God's help, we can work now to build a future that will be bright.

Asbury Parish Nurse Program and Breakdown of Services

- 1. Contacts made by the nurses since January 2021 average 90-115 people each month.
- 2. Sympathy cards and one-year anniversary of death cards are mailed to our members.
- 3. We were asked to give the prayer for the Unity Point Hospital for Donor Celebration Day.
- 4. Guidelines for visits:
 - a. Hospital, hospice, notice of death visits (as needed)
 - b. Skilled Care- weekly visits
 - c. Memory Care Checks monthly visits
 - d. Long-term Care monthly visits
 - e. Assisted Living monthly visits
 - f. Independent Living quarterly visits
- 5. Monitor visiting notes by others on the Asbury website. Intervene when red flags or concerns are detected and do a follow-up visit.
- 6. Host Blood Drives and Foot Clinics.
- 7. Hospital Visits pastors and parish nurses take turns during the week to visit those in the hospital.
- 8. Submit health information on the announcement loop and the Asbury website and Facebook page.
- 9. Follow up with prayer request cards that are submitted as well as requests made through the online *Caring Congregation* prayer request form.
- 10. Offer Grief Share Classes twice a year. This is an 11-week program. Also offer Grief Share "Surviving the Holidays" once a year or online as needed.
- 11. Offer blood pressure checks to members upon request.
- 12. Help set up health programs and/or speakers for different classes throughout the year
- 13. Newborn Ministry Make a home visit and provide a gift basket with special gifts for the family.
- 14. Meet weekly with the pastors to update health related concerns of parishioner visits and keep each other informed.
- 15. Manage Angel Fund offering help to members when needed. Example: gas & grocery gift cards
- 16. Offer an all-church Afghan Ministry to the Bettendorf and Davenport community.
- 17. Coordinate and serve luncheons at funerals under the umbrella of the Hospitality Team. We are available at the funerals for family support.
- 18. Attend Church Council meetings monthly in person or on Zoom.
- 19. Maintain and monitor first-aid kits throughout the church. Put together and maintain travel first-aid kits.
- 20. A nurse is present upon request for youth events and VBS.
- 21. Outreach Program to those in need (non-church members). Provide food baskets at Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter and food for the Bettendorf after-school program.
- 22. Make sure all staff have CPR provided to keep their status updated.
- 23. Monitor, maintain and educate staff on AED in the church. Offer education to congregation on use of AED upon request.
- 24. Provide monthly reports to Unity Point Parish Nurse Program Manager.
- 25. Maintain a library of health resources located in the parish nurse office.
- 26. Parish nurses attend classes on health issues around the area as provided and attend the monthly parish nurse meetings held by Unity Point.
- 27. Maintain confidentiality for all our members.
- 28. We are available 24/7 and receive calls at all hours and days of the week.



March, 2020-September, 2021 UPDATE SINCE COVID 19



Meeting with Friends on Zoom



The effects of the COVID pandemic have been felt throughout the Asbury community. The church went to online services during much of the time from March 2020 through March 2021. As the services went online most meetings were conducted via ZOOM. People are gradually returning now that it has been deemed safe to do so while wearing a mask. Regardless, most of the small groups continued to meet because their focus was still about maintaining relationship with God and others. They have been able to continue studies and to offer conversation feedback, fellowship, encouragement, and support. They continued to hold each other up in prayer and experienced personal discovery and spiritual growth which helped them cope with the many challenges that the present-day world presents. September 2021 found the small groups that meet on Sunday back in the church as well as offering the class via ZOOM.

Adult Ministry Statistics Summary

From January 2020-September 2021, there were an average of 143 adults in a group either on Sunday or during the week. During that same time period, there was an average of 124 people in worship service either online or in person. (These stats are as exact as they can be, but due to the challenges of getting people to sign in, may not present an entirely accurate picture). However, anyway one looks at these stats, the small groups held together and found a way to continue to stay connected!

When COVID became a factor in March 2020, the Adult Small Groups went to ZOOM and continued to meet. Currently, ADVENTURES IN FAITH, AGAPE, and CIA are meeting together on Sunday mornings. EXPLORATIONS is also meeting and involved in a different study. The groups scheduled during the week are all meeting, mostly via ZOOM.

The Summer Adult Sunday School Class studied lessons from THE BIBLE PROJECT. This class ran for 12 weeks with 39 different people attending at least one session. There was an average of 17 people attending either in person or via ZOOM each week.

Some of the groups were involved in service projects such as Hiney Heroes, the Thrift Center, Garden Ministry, Salvation Army Bell Ringing at K and K Hardware, landscaping around the church, Dress for Success, Winnie's Place, Wish, the dinner held at The Center, donations of winter wear items, diapers, provided items for the Lenten Bags, and money contributions to various organizations.

In an effort to reach out to all members/families of Asbury, the Adult Ministry Team organized a Lenten Bag which was presented to each household. The AMT continues to offer materials to groups that are meeting and continues working toward the goals of disciplining, educating, developing leaders, and reaching others.

The Children's Ministry has been busy keeping the Asbury family active and safe. During Covid each child in the Roots Kids program had Christmas packages delivered to their doors with crafts and goodies wishing them a Merry Christmas and blessed New Year.

During the winter and spring months, a children's Roots Times was included in the services to help the children stay connected online. Easter bags were delivered to the Asbury children in the spring. An outdoor community Easter egg hunt, in conjunction with other area United Methodist churches, took car loads of families around Bettendorf/Davenport homes in search of Easter eggs hidden around homes. We were excited to bring VBS back this summer. Professor Donut and his assistant entertained the children with science experiments, crafts, games and a Bible Lesson. During the 4th of July, while Bettendorf was celebrating downtown with children's games and music, Asbury Church put on the show Pinochio from the Spotlight Theater.

As the new school year rolled around the church opened up with bringing the children back to normalcy with our Sunday School program - Roots Kids which started off with a Rally Day of games and stories. We offer Roots Kids two times on Sunday, one for parents who want to worship with their children and the other for parents who want to attend church while their children go to Roots Kids. We run a one-room schoolhouse format with puppets, a bible story, an object lesson and a game to follow.

Fall bags were delivered to **Roots Kids** homes with goodies and information of upcoming Christmas opportunities. We held our first Falloween for our community, bringing in cars for Trunk-or-Treat, along with fall games and a maze. We served around 500 children and their families! We also began the 4-5th grade Kids Club every first Wednesday of the month again, where we enjoy fun events together and each other's fellowship.

As the holidays approach we are preparing to bring One Starry Night back for it's second year. This is a community event, with stations of the journey to Bethlehem and involves our whole church family.

We are also rehearsing a children's program with handbells, a skit and music for the Family Christmas Eve service. Christmas bags will also be delivered to our church children's doors in the coming weeks.

Our challenge will be, and has been, getting our families back into church and the children's programs. One of the church's goals this year is to grow our children's program. We are bringing in programs to help children feel connected and safe. With God's blessing we are on a good path!

202 | Year-End Finance Team Report

Finance Co-Chairs: Aaron Christopher & Cliff Pim

As we are approaching the end of the year, the Finance Team is pleased to report that our church is positioned to end the year financially sound. This includes full payment of our apportionments to the lowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. The pandemic continues to have an impact on our finances. Overall giving was lower this year but expenses were also lower so that our cash flow was manageable.

Organizationally, the Finance Team, under the Leadership of Aaron Christopher, took the lead by experimenting with quarterly meetings instead of every month. This turned out to be a more efficient use of committee members' time.

We also revised our budgeting process to look at actual expenses of the prior year rather than the previous year's budget number. The goal is to have a Ministry Funding Plan (budget) that more closely predicts actual giving and spending. A working Ministry Funding Plan was approved in December of which a summary is available upon request.

Financial estimates of giving from members of the congregation for 2022 have been coming in a bit ahead of last year. We encourage anyone who hasn't yet shared an estimate of giving response with the church to please do so.

GARDEN MINISTRY

2021 HARVEST-51,528 LBS

Our Garden Ministry's 21st season was truly blessed with a record harvest of over 51,500 lbs. of fresh vegetables that were distributed to over 20 organizations that included food pantries, meal sites, home shelters, and senior living apartment complexes. In addition, some produce was distributed to individual families. Since its beginning in the spring of 2002, over 664,000 lbs. of fresh vegetables have been distributed. Three highlights of this season: installation of an underground watering line running from the water faucet on the side of the Grace Evangelical Free Church to the garden plot which eliminated the need to unwind and roll-up hundreds of feet of water hoses to water the plot; the purchase and use of a potato digger to replace the hand digging of over 3600 hills of potatoes; and the receipt of a Carma Mohler grant from the lowa United Methodist Foundation for \$1500. Sincere thanks to the volunteers whose involvement contributed to this successful gardening season!

We believe that caring for God's creation is an essential part of our Christian faith. We honor God's Creation by protecting and preserving it for future generations. Everyone is invited to take part in the Steward of Creation ministry Please join us as we put our faith into action.

Goals and Actions

To inspire and encourage everyone to actively participate in creation care.

Monthly challenges - 30+ different challenges so far! Examples this year: Use less paper, Meatless Mondays, Avoid plastic packaging, Strive for sustainable fashion choices, Power down Electronics, Avoid Buying New, Pick Up Litter, Share appreciation for creation with a child, Talk with or write to government, religious or business leaders about solutions to the environmental and climate crisis, Pray for creation. Share creation gifts.

Terracycle "drop off" inside Asbury Church - About 2,000 Chip/Snack bags and cereal bags have been collected! We are also accepting pens, highlighters, markers, glue sticks, toothpaste tubes (caps on) & dental floss containers.

Notification of church, community and online events - Examples: X-stream clean-ups & invasive species removal, "Project Sock Take Back" & denim material recycling events, "Great Backyard Bird Count" & bird migration forecast response, Interfaith Power & Light's Faith Climate Action Week film and webinar.

Offer sharing opportunities so others can be inspired by our actions - Examples: Sharing our resolutions for creation, our prayers and ways we have supported creation throughout the year on Facebook.

To promote awareness about creation's current needs and offer information about ways we can support creation. Examples: "Monthly Challenge" support and information about creation related organizations, books, movies and faith filled responses (on Facebook site) and provide opportunities to talk about these topics, learn, seek hope and discover how to take meaningful action in our individual lives and together as a church community. 2022 Possibility: Co-ordinate creation efforts with Asbury groups and committees and serve as a hub for communication regarding creation.

Initiate ways to be a "Green Church" with sustainable and energy efficient practices. Examples: LED conversion project throughout the church, improving recycling habits (especially cardboard), properly disposing of ewaste, plastic and paper reduction. Programmable thermostat checked and set for maximum efficiency. Removed old, drafty, unused window air conditioners, sealed and insulated the area.

Seek to provide hope –Example: Sharing ways people are protecting and supporting creation. (Primarily on Facebook page) 2022 Possibility: Show Christ's love and give comfort to those affected by environmental and climate change in coordination with our Asbury in Mission team.

Since its inception, the Card Ministry has sent nearly 5,000 cards to over 550 recipients. Shown here are examples of their beautiful cards!




















Women in Ministry




