

Throughout March in worship we will continue to seek inspiration from Jesus' last moments on the cross. It is often said that Jesus was dying on the cross. But another way to look at it is that Jesus was also still living on the cross.

Our Mission of the Month for March is our monthly outreach project working with Churches United to prepare and serve a meal to homeless and those in need of an evening meal at Zion Lutheran Church in Davenport. Asbury has been preparing and serving a meal once a month to those in need for many years. Currently, we are serving approximately 60 meals each month.

In an effort to give more Asburians an opportunity to serve and participate in this important outreach mission, we are changing Asbury's process which has been in place since Covid times.

Effective with our May 3rd Meal Prep and Serve, we will be providing and serving a routine and fairly easy dinner menu at Zion. In March and April, we are asking Asbury members and families to sign-up to be on a team of 5 or 6 people that will be assigned no more than 2 months a year to prep the food, transport and serve the Wednesday night meal.
