The dictionary tells us that a miracle is an extraordinary event that reveals divine activity. The whole Bible is the ongoing story of God interacting with humanity from the beginning of time. During Lent we have used the theme of the "Seven Mile Miracle" as a way to learn from the seven words that are attributed to Jesus while he was still alive on the cross. Seven miles was the distance mentioned in Luke 24:13 from Jerusalem where Jesus died, to the town of Emmaus where Jesus revealed himself to two of his disciples. His miraculous presence changed their lives forever.

Now we are ready to celebrate how the miracle of Jesus continues to affect us. In our worship services during Holy Week, Easter and the Sunday after Easter we will see how the risen Jesus connects us to God and each other and how miracles continue to happen.

Your life can be changed by the presence of Jesus. It would be an extraordinary event that reveals divine activity. It's going to be a wonderful Easter. Expect a miracle.

Beginning Sunday, April 16, 2023, Pam Thornton and Marian Paulson will be leading the study entitled THE WALK by Adam Hamilton. In this easy-to-read book, Hamilton focuses on five essential spiritual practices that are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God and taught throughout the New Testament. We want to offer a Grief Share support group this Spring/Summer. In this program, you will learn how to walk the journey of grief and be supported on the way. It is a place where grieving people find healing and hope. One participant said, "it's not an easy path, but you can make it through. I've been through Grief Share three times and every time, I've healed more...I'm still healing".

There are 10 group sessions (one per week) which last approximately 2 hours each. Each participant will have a workbook for their own use; we will watch videos with testimonials; we will have discussion (no one is required to share their story but may if they choose); we will support one another throughout. Grief Share is a spiritual based program although one does not need to have certain beliefs in order to participate.

We have not determined a time or day of the week. Please contact Carol or Cheryl regarding your interest and let us know what would work best for you. When we have received some feedback, a definite start date will be determined. We anticipate late April or early May as a start date.

Since its beginning in the spring of 2002, our Ministry has taken a "bite out of hunger" by providing fresh vegetables to local food pantries, meal sites, home shelters, low-income senior living complexes, and individual needy families. About 724,000 lbs. have been harvested since its inception.

As mentioned previously, our Ministry has become more mechanized with the purchase of a new subcompact John Deere tractor, a tiller, a mower, a culti-packer, and a mulch layer. Having this equipment will allow us to be better stewards of the garden space generously donated by the Grace Evangelical Free Church. Sincere thanks for the donations received to purchase this
