<u>May 28</u>: Victory Songs. Psalm 30 Music that celebrates God's power. Pentecost and the Birthday of the Church




Discipleship Pathway Moment

In the last Good News Pastor Tom shared the *Discipleship Pathway-My Growth as a Disciple*. We hope you have had a chance to look at it and choose an area or two to focus on. Each month the Discipleship Team will spotlight one area of the Pathway. **May's focus is PRAYER.**

Prayer in its simplest form is a conversation between you and God. Prayer is not always easy. How do you begin a prayer life? Adam Hamilton tells us in his book "The Walk" that we should start by praying 5 times a day. He suggests that we pray first thing in the morning, at each meal, and again at bedtime. That is easy enough to remember! It may seem like a lot, but as you are starting out each prayer can be as simple as "Thank You"! As your prayer life moves along the Pathway you will begin to also include praises to God, confession and asking for forgiveness, asking for blessings and help for yourself and others, and asking how to be God's hands and feet on earth.

Our Missions for May are **Terracycle and <u>EARTHDAY.ORG</u>'S "Canopy Project".** Donations toward these two initiatives help us be stewards of God's creation by using resources wisely through recycling and taking an action that helps protect God's creation from climate change. Checks may be made to Asbury with "May AIM" on the memo line or you may give online at <u>JesusIsTheBridge.org</u>, click on the "Online Giving" link and choose the "Missions & Special Giving" option.

Terracycle is an eco-ministry located at Trinity Lutheran Church in Moline. They collect, sort and send items to recycling centers, to be made into new products. Since 2019, Asbury has collected almost 5,000 chip and cereal bags and various other items not eligible for our curbside recycling! Terracycle relies on financial donations for the purchase of Zero-Waste boxes and shipping costs to keep this program available here in the Quad Cities.

EARTHDAY.ORG's Canopy Project improves our shared environment by planting trees across the globe. They work with global partners to reforest areas in dire need of rehabilitation. This reforestation helps many disadvantaged communities, increases habitat for species, and combats climate change. Trees filter the air, reverse the impacts of land degradation and provide food, energy and income to communities. Since 2010, EARTHDAY.ORG[™] has planted tens of millions of trees!
