#### 2023 Iowa Annual Conference

The Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church was held on June 4-6 at the Rec Plex in West Des Moines. The Conference met in a space that also serves as an ice arena. (But there was no ice during the Conference.) Pat and Pam Thornton attended as Lay Members from the Asbury Church along with Pastor Tom.

A significant event was the official disaffiliation of 83 congregations that had gone through a process to leave the United Methodist Church. The major issue has been different interpretations of the Gospel on how to live with LGBTQIA persons. This represented about 15% of the United Methodist congregations in Iowa. While there was grief and sadness over those leaving the denomination, there was also a sense of hope that all churches can move forward in representing Jesus to the people of their communities as they feel led by God.



Bishop Kennetha Bigham-Tsai presided for the first time and brought her own style of grace, inspiration and humor to the body. The business of the Annual Conference included worship, prayer and actions that affect our combined ministries in

# Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team



At Rachel Circle this week, we listened to a presentation by Amy Gutknecht (she is a senior living consultant at Quartet) about Dementia Friends Iowa. This is the group in our state which is part of the Dementia Friendly America Initiative. This is a global movement developed by the Alzheimer's Society in the United Kingdom and is now underway in the United States. This Iowa initiative supports the growth of the Dementia Friends movement in Iowa. The goal is to help everyone in a community understand five key messages about dementia, how it affects people, and how we each can make a difference in the lives of people living with the disease. The five key messages about dementia are:

- Dementia is not a normal part of aging. Not everyone who grows old will develop dementia.
- Dementia is caused by diseases of the brain. The most common is Alzheimer's.
- Dementia is not just about having memory problems. It can affect thinking, communication and doing everyday tasks.
- It is possible to have a good quality of life with dementia.
