Garden Ministry Update....The planting phase of the 22nd year of our Garden Ministry is now complete, thanks to the dedicated efforts of many volunteers. Use of the new equipment purchased last fall facilitated getting the one acre plot planted. Having access to a subcompact tractor and a mulch layer enabled the making of raised beds in which drip lines for irrigation were laid. Raised beds are in all sections of the garden except for the tomato patch; the tomato plants are watered via cans buried by each plant. Without having the drip lines and watering cans during this extremely dry gardening season, a bountiful harvest would not have been possible. The garden looks Awesome! It appears to be "an oasis in the desert". Church members are encouraged to visit the garden plot which is located just north of 53rd Street on Eastern Avenue (behind the parking lot of our landlord-the Grace Evangelical Free Church). Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team July is National Watermelon Month!



At just 80 calories for a 2-cup serving and 25% of your recommended Daily Value for vitamin C, watermelon is one of the best fruits to enjoy while keeping you hydrated this summer! How to choose a good watermelon? Choose one that is firm, free of cuts, dents, or bruises, and feels heavy for its size. There should be a light yellow-colored spot on the bottom, which means it sat in the field for some time ripening in the sun! It should last roughly 3to 4weeks after being harvested.

Top 10 Ways to Enjoy Ripe Watermelon:

- 1. Just the way it is! It's full of important nutrients like water, vitamins A and C, lycopene and potassium.
- 2. Sip it. Make a pitcher and enjoy it blended with sparkling water.
- 3. Slice it as you would pizza and top it with strawberry cream cheese, almonds & berries.
- 4. Make a smoothie with watermelon cubes, yogurt, bananas and strawberries.
- 5. Freeze it into 'ice' cubes and add it to your daily water allotment.
- 6. Chop it up into a salsa. Use watermelon, feta cheese, and red onion with olive oil and balsamic vinegar. Put it on grilled chicken or white fish.
- 7. Make watermelon popsicles. Blend it with fresh lime juice or limeade and freeze.
- 8. Grill it. Drizzle it with honey, lime juice and olive oil whisked together.
- 9. Dehydrate it to make watermelon jerky!
- 10. Top your salad with diced watermelon along with an oil and vinegar dressing.
