

Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team



TOMATOES: Yes, there are still plenty of them both red and green. If you have had your fill of them for now, give some thought to freezing them. It's easy! You can freeze them whole, sliced, chopped or sauced. I have used the whole and sliced method by washing them, coring and/or slicing them. Place them on a flat baking sheet; then to the freezer. Once solidly frozen, put them in a bag or other container and use as desired. No other prep necessary. I have also seen simple recipes for salsa verde which can use many green tomatoes quickly. It might be a nice change from the usual red salsa. And remember, no matter when you use tomatoes, they are good for you!!



On another, quite different note, we have all heard about cases of COVID occurring more frequently right now. Remember to do the same things we did before: wash your hands (more than you think is necessary) and stay home if you don't feel well, especially if you have a fever.
