Mission of the Month in January: Mark Twain Elementary School Backpack Ministry

An Asbury goal for the last 2 years was to reestablish our relationship with neighborhood schools. We are excited that Asbury is once again partnering with Mark Twain to provide backpacks filled with nutritious snacks for designated elementary students. With the help of Jo Winegar, who is purchasing the snack items, and a few volunteers who are filling and delivering the backpacks, we will be continuing to provide backpacks filled with snacks to 36 students monthly through the end of the school year in May. As we rekindle this outreach ministry, we are continuing to explore how to fund this on a monthly basis while also hoping to expand our Mark Twain partnership in other meaningful ways such as reading to students or listening to students read.
