Through the season of Lent we have compared Jesus' short stories and images about the kingdom of heaven to postcards that people send from exotic places. The message on those postcards often is, "I wish you were here."

It's a way of saying that a place is so wonderful that you want others to experience it along with you. During Holy week we will see how this expression can also take on a whole different meaning. On the night in which Jesus was taken to be crucified, he prayed in the garden of Gethsemane. He was going through a terrible ordeal and he was calling out to God for relief in a prayer that could also be expressed as, "I wish you were here." There are times in life when we experience great difficulties and need comfort and strength from others in order to survive.

In the first situation, life is so good that a person can send a message that says, "I wish you were here" in order to share in the joy. In a similar way, when life is so hard that a person can barely survive, the same message of "I wish you were here" can express the need for the comfort and strength that comes from companionship.

As we experience the story of Holy Week this year, we can remember the good times and the bad times that we must walk through. The joy of Easter is hearing the response of God when our prayer of, "I wish you were here" is answered by God in Jesus with, "I am here."

I hope you'll join me during Holy Week as we relive the tragic and glorious story of Jesus' death and resurrection and what it means for us today. The Kingdom of God is at hand and Jesus is alive and here with us.
