# **Faith and Works**



I am very excited about the study we are going to be sharing this fall. It is a book called "Thrive" and it takes us through the book of James.

James is a book that does not get as much attention as the writings of Paul. Paul, as the most prolific writer in the New Testament, often dominates New Testament Bible study. Sometimes more minor authors get neglected.

Paul discusses how important it is to remember that it is faith, not works, that save us. But James gives us an important balance pointing out that faith without works is a dead faith.

An exclusive reliance on Paul (without James and the gospels) might make you think that a Christian can simply believe and that God has no expectations on your life. But James reminds us that our actions are important, and that doing good for God and others is an important part of living out the Christian life.

John Wesley famously said that the only holiness is social holiness. We show our love for God in how we love others. I hope you will participate with us in the Thrive study and take time to read it and other passages from James this fall.


Asbury Blood Drive is Monday, August 25, 2:30-5:00pm

# Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team August is National Immunization Awareness Month!



Vaccination is the most important thing we can do to protect ourselves and our children against ill health. They prevent millions of deaths worldwide every year.

### Vaccines Do...


- $\sqrt{}$  help to protect you and your child from many serious and potentially deadly diseases
- $\sqrt{}$  protect other people in your family and community—by helping to stop diseases spreading to people who cannot have vaccines, such as babies too young to be vaccinated and those who are too ill to be vaccinated
- $\sqrt{}$  undergo rigorous safety testing before being introduced—they're also constantly monitored for side effects after being introduced
- $\sqrt{}$  sometimes cause mild side effects that will not last long—you may feel a bit unwell and have a sore arm for 2 or 3 days
- $\sqrt{\text{reduce or even get rid of some diseases}}$ —if enough people are vaccinated

#### Vaccines Do Not...

- X overload or weaken the immune system—it's safe to give children and adults several vaccines at a time and this reduces the amount of injections needed
- X contain mercury (thiomersal)
- X contain any ingredients that cause harm—only ingredients essential to making them safer and more effective and only in very small amounts
- X cause autism—studies have found no evidence of a link between the MMR vaccine and autism
