


#### **Church Council Meeting**

Our next two articles will be about being prepared for emergencies such as power outages, storms and winter weather. We will give you brief suggestions here, but you can find more extensive information on the Parish Nurse Wall Display just outside of the office.

#### • • • POWER OUTAGE • • •

A power outage happens, of course, when electrical power is lost unexpectedly. This may disrupt communications, water utilities and transportation. It may cause businesses, stores, gas stations, ATMs, banks, schools and other services to close. It may cause food spoilage. It may prevent you from using medical devices. Power outages are more likely to occur during severe weather events such as strong thunderstorms, and winter storms or other natural disasters. Some things to do when a power outage happens include:

- Keep freezers and refrigerators closed. A refrigerator will keep food cold for about 4 hours. A freezer will stay at a safe temperature for about 48 hours. When the Power Goes
- Use generators outdoors and at least 20 feet away from building openings.
- Do not use a gas stove to heat your home.
- Unplug electronics to avoid damage from electrical urges.
- Make a plan for refrigerating medicines and powering medical devices.
- Keep electronic phones and electronic equipment charged before a power outage.
- Stay fire safe. Use flashlights, lanterns and other battery powered lights. Avoid use of candles or open flame.
