
As we enter these holy days and seasons, I pray that you will take the time to worship God, be thankful, and celebrate what Christ has done for us.



Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team November is National Caregivers Month





As we think about caregivers this month, we want to give a shout out to everyone who cares for others in a specific or general way. Even though you are not often formally recognized as a caregiver, all that you do for another is vital to their wellbeing.

Caregiving can be challenging and rewarding. It is hard work at times. In this and the next newsletter, we will list some helpful hints and suggestions. First, we will share information about Respite Care:

Respite Care is temporary and specifically meant to provide a time of rest and relief for the caregiver. There are several types of respite care:

Home Care Aides can help with personal care, housework and cooking as a one-time only service or a weekly/daily service.

Adult Day Care offers activities, meals, exercise and the chance to be with others for the person who needs this assistance.

Overnight Stays may be offered by assisted living and other facilities for overnight help for a few days or for weeks.

Informal Respite Care can be provided by friends or family by staying with the person for a few hours or a weekend. Community organizations may also have individuals who volunteer for this type of care.

The main thing that a caregiver needs to remember is this: If you do not take care of yourself, you cannot care for another. Respite care may be just the thing to avoid burnout or illness. Do not hesitate to make time for yourself!
