Unity—Looking Forward and Not Back! # #

I've been very pleased to see a growing unity of vision and purpose in the United Methodist Church since our last General Conference in May of 2024. In that General Conference, we made significant changes to the Book of Discipline allowing more choices to be available in the ministry of pastors and the local church to match the context of the ministry we are each called to.

We decided, after many years of debate, to leave decisions around marriage to pastors and congregations following the Holy Spirit as we seek to broaden our welcome to all people in God's Church. The changes received a very high level of support.

We also voted on major constitutional amendments, which allow for the regionalization of the United Methodist Church. These amendments allow different regions of the world to make their own best decisions on many areas of ministry in their own culture, language and context. For the first time since the founding of the UMC, our denomination is no long US centric. Each region of our denomination will have an equal say in mission and ministry. These amendments passed not only the General Conference vote but also passed Annual Conference member votes, each by more than 90%. What a great sign of unity!

Here at Asbury UMC, I'm pleased to see a unity in our ministries and our decisions together as we seek to chart our congregation's future course.

At a called Church Conference, the members of Asbury were invited to attend and vote on the purchase of property on Brown Street which gives us more options for future ministry. I was thrilled to see fifty-six (56) members of Asbury UMC present to vote. It was a great turnout! I was even more pleased that our vote was so unified. The count of our written ballots was 55-1 in favor of the purchase of the property.

While buying the property is an important ministry step, I was most pleased that you made this decision together. I sensed a strong excitement and a great sense of unanimity of spirit! Everyone got to vote as they felt, and we have moved forward on a decision that was a couple of years in the making. I know we cannot always be in as close an agreement as we were at that conference, but I'm thrilled that the leadership of Asbury is always looking to make sure everyone's opinions and ideas are included.

It is my hope that the United Methodist Church will only look forward and not look back, and that we as Asbury UMC will continue to move forward in unity of mission and purpose as we share God's love!



Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team November is National Caregivers Month





Caregiving is not an easy job, but it can be very rewarding. Here are some things to think about as you continue the work of being a caregiver.

Your Needs and Wishes are Important Too

- Taking care of yourself is as important as caring for your loved one.
- Be sure to eat well, get enough rest and exercise regularly.
- •The healthier you are, the better care you will provide.
- Don't be afraid to say you need a breakno one can do it all the time.



If You are Balancing Work and Caregiving. Talk to Your Employer about Flexibility

- You may be able to take time off from work under the Family and Medical Leave Act.
- A social worker or nurse who assists people in finding care for an older adult is called a care or case manager.
- A care manager helps find services.
- Contact your county social services, local area agency on aging (Milestones) or senior center (CASI) to find out about services.
- If the person you are caring for has low or moderate income, you may be able to get financial assistance through the county or state.

All Caregivers Feel Overwhelmed at Times

- If you feel angry or often lose patience with the person you are caring for, or if you use alcohol, drugs or medications to cope, get help.
- If you are depressed, talk to a doctor, counselor or therapist.
- It is critical for caregivers to develop a support system.
- One of the best resources for caregivers is other caregivers.
- Caregiver support groups can help you connect with others who are going through similar experiences.
