Did you know that Christians did not regularly celebrate Christmas until around 336 AD? This is when we find evidence of the earliest Christmas celebrations. Early Christians celebrated Easter, Pentecost, and Epiphany regularly, however in the early church the celebration of birthdays was discouraged as being too self-centered.

In the beginning, Christmas was celebrated to emphasize the importance of the incarnation of Christ as both the son of human beings, as well as the son of God. It was also in opposition to the heresy of the theologian, Arius, who proposed the idea that Jesus was not the eternal son of God, but created by God the Father. The church condemned this theology; declaring that Jesus Christ, the Father, and the Spirit were all equally three-in-one and one-in-three.

Christmas celebrations were placed on December 25th in part because there were already community celebrations scheduled around this date and the winter solstice. This allowed Christians to use that as an opportunity to invite the whole community to celebrate in the birth of Christ.

As you prepare for Christmas during this Advent season, remember that Christ was born among us so that he could offer us everlasting life.
